- Review the rules of the school with your child.
- Provide positive reinforcement to your child when they follow the rules at home-

"Great job setting the table, Tommy!"


"I love how you were caring to your brother when you shared your toys, Jane."

"You are being very responsible when you pick up your things and put them away, Aiden. Keep up the good work, I'm proud of you!"

- Reinforce making good choices and following the rules. Make a big deal about earning golden tickets!
- Use positive words when describing what you want your child to do:

"Please pick up your socks and put them in the hamper" instead of "Don't throw your socks on the floor!"

- If your child has difficulty following the rules at school, please be consistent in giving consequences so your child gets the same message from both school and home.



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

Positive Behavior Intervention and Support Program

PBS stands for Positive Behavior Support. It is a research based program where students are reinforced for making good choices. Each classroom teacher teaches lessons on how to behave in the classroom, hallway, cafeteria, lavatory, playground and on the bus. Students are "caught being good" and given verbal positive reinforcement or recognition from their school.



Rules- Three "Be's"

- ♦ Be Safe
- ♦ Be Caring
- ♦ Be Responsible

Program- The Principal's 200 Club is a magnetic board in the office. A Golden Ticket can be given any time a student is observed following the rules. They are distributed randomly to 10 staff members a day. When a student gets a Golden Ticket:

- Staff makes a positive phone call home.
- Student signs the Celebrity Book.
- Student receives a small reward (eraser, pencil, etc).

Student gets a magnet on the

Principal's 200 Club board and will take their magnet home once there is a winning row and may win a bigger prize if they have the winning row on the board.

Once there is a winning row, the board will be cleared, and all students on the board will receive their magnet. The process begins again. All staff members have chances to hand out tickets.
