**The Greater Nanticoke Area School District will continue to follow all PA DOH, PDE and CDC guidelines to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Depending upon the public health conditions in our region and the Commonwealth, there could be additional actions, orders, or guidance provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) and/or the Pennsylvania Department of Health (DOH). The District will practice and support mitigation efforts in response to changing conditions. The District is prepared to practice prevention and mitigation strategies along a continuum of most to least restrictive in response to the changing conditions of the Pandemic.**

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

**The Greater Nanticoke Area School District will continue to offer full in-person instruction to all students during the 2023-2024 school year. If the school needs to move to the virtual mode of instruction due to a COVID-19 outbreak based on an unknown variant that is not covered by current available vaccines, students will work from home utilizing their assigned Google Chromebook. Google Chromebooks were issued the first week of school. Students may also choose the Greater Nanticoke Area Cyber Academy if parents do not feel like sending their children back to school due to COVID-19 concerns.**

**Attendance will be taken in school for all face-to-face learning days. In the case of remote learning days, verification and completion of assignments will be counted as attendance and to track instructional hours. Students will be expected to complete all materials posted on Google Classroom in the event remote instruction needs to be employed.**

**The Greater Nanticoke Area School District will continue to employ a mental health worker during the school year to assist students with mental health needs. The worker is employed through the ARP/ESSER Grant.**

Students and teachers in Grades PreK 12 in all district buildings retroactive to will have the option to wear face masks due to the decline in cases in Luzerne County and the School District as well as the availability of vaccines and therapeutics. If the case count increases due to an unforeseen breakout or a new variant, the Superintendent will reinstate the mask mandate after consulting the Board of Education.</li> <li>2. The district will adhere to any guidelines regarding wearing of masks per the PA DOH, CDC, and PDE.</li> </ol>
<p>b. Modifying facilities to allow for <a href="#">physical distancing</a> (e.g., use of cohorts/podding);</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. All students will be socially distanced a minimum of three feet or more in classrooms and cafeterias per CDC guidelines.</li> <li>2. Students in Kennedy Early Childhood Center will continue to eat breakfast and lunch in their classrooms.</li> <li>3. Students in the Elementary Center will eat lunch both in their classrooms and in the gymnasium to keep them distant on a rotating basis.</li> <li>4. High School and Educational Center students will eat in the cafeteria keeping a minimum of three feet social distanced at cafeteria tables.</li> </ol>

	5. The district will adhere to the current CDC, PA DOH, and PDE guidelines established.
c. <a href="#">Handwashing and respiratory etiquette</a> ;	All students will continue to be educated in handwashing and respiratory etiquette during the school year in grades PK-12 per CDC, PA DOH and PDE guidelines.
d. <a href="#">Cleaning</a> and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving <a href="#">ventilation</a> ;	Follow current CDC, PA DOH, and PDE guidelines for cleaning and ventilation. Continue SOP cleaning protocols.
e. <a href="#">Contact tracing</a> in combination with <a href="#">isolation</a> and <a href="#">quarantine</a> , in collaboration with the State and local health departments;	<p>Contact tracing and isolation of non-vaccinated students will occur in cases whereby students are siblings and/or are living in the same household with an infected person.</p> <p>Follow current CDC, PA DOH, and PDE guidelines for contact tracing, isolation, and quarantine guidance.</p>
f. <a href="#">Diagnostic</a> and screening testing;	Diagnostic and screening testing will be done at the discretion of parents at their choosing. Temperature checks will be reinstated if conditions warrant. Follow any current diagnostic testing and screening procedures required by the PA DOC and PDE.
g. Efforts to provide <a href="#">vaccinations to school communities</a> ;	The district will continue to encourage staff and students to be vaccinated as this is the best way to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 and COVID-19 variants.
h. Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and	Special accommodations for students with disabilities will be made. For example, students unable to wear masks due to health concerns or students that are intellectually challenged.
i. Coordination with state and local health officials.	Maintain existing partnerships with local and state PA DOH and PDE and emergency management as needed.


